ABOUT ACCS

The **Association of Christian Counsellors (Singapore) (ACCS)** is a national professional body for Christian counsellors in Singapore established on 28 August 2004. It is non-governmental and non-profit in nature.

THE MISSION AND VISION OF ACCS IS TO:

- Position and profile Christian counselling profession in Singapore;
- · Gather and identify Christian counsellors and Christian practitioners;
- · Establish core competencies and training programs in Christian counselling; and
- · Connect the Christian community and general public to Christian counselling services.

In 2018, ACCS joined the Asia Christian Counseling Association (ACCA) as a Member and has since been regularly involved in their board meetings, monthly intercessory prayer times as well as other events.

With the COVID-19 pandemic situation in Singapore in 2020, ACCS went virtual, conducing the Annual General Meeting, electing the new Executive Committee of 2020 to 2022, and Members Networking events all online.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

2020 has been a significant year for the Association, particularly due to the COVID-19 pandemic. We moved all our activities, including our Annual General Meeting, online. Given the allowance permitted under the COVID-19 (Temporary Measures) Act 2020, ACCS also saw the new Executive Committee (2020 to 2022) being elected to office.

During the Circuit Breaker, we published COVID-19 Resources comprising of articles on our website, as an attempt to provide some information for our members as well as to help members of the public have some form of meaning-making regarding the pandemic.

In addition to the new Executive Committee coming on board this past year, we have also been able to establish the Events Sub-committee and Publicity Sub-committee so that we can continue to serve the needs of our members and to remain in connection. MS ABIGAIL LEE PRESIDENT

Abigail Lee is the Executive Director of Healing Hearts Centre, and the current President of both the Association of Christian Counsellors (Singapore) and the Association for Play Therapy (Singapore). She was conferred the May Day Awards - Working People's Advocate Award by the National Trades Union Congress in May 2018.



With close to 15 years of experience as a counsellor, play therapist, supervisor and trainer, Abigail works

with children, adolescents, individuals and families who have experienced trauma, abuse and anxiety issues. She is a Certified Circle of Security Facilitator with Circle of Security International and a Certified TraumaPlay therapist and supervisor. In addition, she is appointed by the Family Justice Courts as a Parenting Coordinator and by the Singapore Mediation Centre as a Collaborative Family Practice Counsellor to work with families undergoing separation and divorce.

MS KOH AI JIN VICE-PRESIDENT

Koh Ai Jin is Counsellor with Barker Road Methodist Church. Her ministry focus include integration of faith & counselling, inner healing & recovery work, marital & family counselling, parent education, counsellor training and supervision.

Ai Jin holds a Masters in Counselling, is a certified instructor for TJTA and Prepare-Enrich, SAC registered Master Clinical Counsellor and Clinical Supervisor. Since her foray into counselling from 1998, she has



ETHICS REPORT BY DR ANGELINE TEOH

On the evening of 18 November, 2019, our team of five members came together to begin working on ACCS' first edition of our Code of Ethics. In the absence of a precedent document that is relevant to Singapore's context of Christian counselling, we pored over the Codes of Ethics of four relevant associations that we had access to:

- American Association of Christian Counselors (AACC)
- The Philippine Association of Christian Counselors (PACC)
- Singapore Association for Counselling (SAC)
- Association for Spiritual, Ethical, and Religious Values in Counseling (ASERVIC) whose Catholic heritage (from New York's Archdiocese and Diocesan Guidance Council) has evolved into its current 4000-strong membership represented by many faiths and beliefs.

We divided up the four associations' documents between ourselves for contextualizing applicable codes to ACCS' expressed ethos and statement of faith. Over two meetings on 7 January and 23 March in 2020, we critiqued and edited one another's contributions before collating them into a cohesive document. The document went through a total of three drafts as we considered and incorporated the feedback of reviewers where appropriate.



On 28 April, we met with the ACCS EXCO to respond to queries and discuss the few final amendments. As of 15 August, 2020, the ACCS Code of Ethics was approved and adopted. This was ACCS' major milestone which our team happily celebrated ten days later over dinner while observing precaution on ary measures — it was

indeed a welcome change to our months of virtual meetings and extensive to-and-fro online discussions.

It was at this celebratory dinner that the idea of proceeding to compile a document of ethical procedures was mooted. In less than a fortnight after that, we met virtually on 6 October, this time to pore over the section on *Procedural Rules* in AACC's Code of Ethics which would eventually become our main reference as our search for current and equivalent documents among clergy drew a blank. On 12 January 2021, we met virtually to discuss and organize our respective contributions into an addendum to ACCS's Code of Ethics. For the rest of 2021, our team will continue to meet to progress the document toward completion.
