President's Message

The newly elected Executive Committee and appointed Sub-Committee members got to work right away to plan, discuss, and attend to the counselling and mental health challenges within the Church and the Christian community. Following the Senior Pastors' Luncheon, held at St Andrew's Cathedral on September 25, 2024, and the discussions that ensued, it was clear that Christian counselling outreach through ACCS was critical to support pastors, ministry leaders, and non-pastoral fulltime staff now and in the coming years ahead. To demonstrate our resolve as an Association, ACCS offers the following services and make our presence and participation known to pastors and the Christian community.

- Facilitating and managing the Christian Mental Health Conference
 Pastors' Mental Health Fund offering a referral process and financial subsidy for mental health services to all who are in fulltime ministry
- 2. Launching a **Mental Well-Being Survey for Church Non-Pastoral Staff** (in 2024)
- 3. Providing a **Referral Database of Counsellors and Clinical Supervisors** on our website
- 4. Representing **Christian Counselling professionals** at the annual **LoveSingapore** Pastors' Prayer Summit
- 5. Pioneering the **Mental Health First Contact (MHFC)** training for Pastors and Leaders (8 runs already)
- 6. Co-organizing of the **Christian Mental Health Conference** with Christian Mental Health Advocates, Promises Healthcare and faith-based social service agencies: Care Corner Singapore, Fei Yue Community Services, Filos Community Services and Samaritans of Singapore

ACCS's Ethical Procedures

The Ethical Procedures was in the making from 2023 after the launch of the ACCS Code of Ethics (in 2022) and after making several updates to the ACCS's Constitution. Developing this Ethical Procedures is essential due to the increased visibility and higher profile of our members and Christian counselling in the churches and community. This may give rise to complaints which can be triggered by clients or members in the community. This document also shows the maturity of the Christian counselling profession in Singapore and the need for internal procedures to be in place for ACCS to attend to such complaints. Thus, the EXCO decided to appoint an Ethics Board to formally manage such complaints. Dr Angeline Teoh and Pastor Adrian Ow were appointed as Co-Chairs of the Ethics Board. A Dialogue Session was held on April 10, 2025. The Ethical Procedures will be presented at the coming AGM for formal acceptance as an Addendum to our Code of Ethics.



Forming of Ethics Board

Two members from the Ethics sub-committee – Mr Adrian Ow and Dr Angeline Teoh – were appointed by the Exco to co-chair the Ethics Board (EB). There were follow-up discussions in the final quarter of 2024 to further refine the submitted EP document:

- 11 September First presentation of EP document to the Exco.
- 7 November Co-chairpersons met with ACCS VP (Mr David Blakely) and Honorary Secretary (Ms Abigail Lee) to review comments and feedback by legal practitioner.
- 23 November Second presentation of revised EP document to the Exco and finalising of EB members.

By the first quarter of 2025, further movements toward formalising the EP took place:

- 5 March First formal contact with members of EB including non-ACCS interdisciplinary professionals.
- 10 March Review copy of EP document sent to all ACCS members.
- 10 April Dialogue with ACCS members about EP as addendum to Code of Ethics 2020.

MENTAL HEALTH CARE AND ADVOCACY

REPORT BY: MR DAVID BLAKELY AND MS CHONG MING LI

We were able to complete the following steps:

First, we were able to review, update, and expand on the Christian counsellor referral list. Second, we reviewed the results of the survey of non-pastoral church staff. We noted that there were concerning statistics, but that the rate of return was too low to make conclusions. We talked through how to expand access to the survey. It was agreed that once the Pastors' Mental Health Fund (means and referral process) is ready for expansion, the survey would provide the link to how the community is informed of the fund. Third, the sub-committee has started the process of developing a platform for new applications for the Pastors' Mental Health Fund.

As a sub-committee we have identified the following tasks as central to the vision of increased mental health care within the Christian community:

First, we have established and will continue to maintain two referral lists. The first is of Christian counsellors and the second is of Christian clinical supervisors. Second, we are working to hear the needs of the full community of church workers, believing that all staff within church (and their immediate families) would benefit from greater access to high quality Christian mental health services. Third, we are developing a process of referral for the Pastors' Mental Health Fund that would meet the projected future needs as more church workers seek out help. Once the process is established, this sub-committee will be responsible for maintaining the referral process.

We want to give thanks and acknowledge each of the sub-committee members and we especially want to thank and acknowledge Ms Chong Ming Li for stepping up as the new chairperson of the sub-committee.
